

REPORT OF THE EXTERNAL ACADEMIC AUDIT
FOR THE ACADEMIC YEAR 2025-26 OF
ISLAMIAH COLLEGE (AUTONOMOUS), VANIYAMBADI

INTRODUCTION

The External Academic Audit of Islamiah College (Autonomous) for the Academic Year 2025–26 was conducted on Thursday, 16th April 2026. The Audit was carried out by the External Academic Auditors, Dr. T. Mohamed Ilyas, NAAC Peer Team Member & Former Principal of Islamiah College (Autonomous) and Dr. C. Dhandapani, Principal, KMG Arts & Science College, Gudiyattam.

The primary objective of the External Academic Audit is to assess the effectiveness and efficiency of Academic and Administrative processes and to ensure that the Academic Departments and Support Services adhere to the prescribed rules, regulations, policies, guidelines and standards, with an emphasis on continuous quality improvements.

The standard procedure for the External Academic Audit includes a systematic physical inspection and review of relevant documents pertaining to the Academic Departments and Support Services, interactions & meetings with concerned stakeholders and analysis of information obtained from the respective Academic Departments. It also involves a comprehensive review of the Internal Academic Audit Report prepared by the Internal Academic Auditors.

The External Academic Audit conducted on 16th April 2025 was based on the Internal Academic Audit Report, as well as deliberations held with the IQAC and the Heads of Academic Departments. The Internal Academic Auditors had previously examined the relevant documents of all Academic Departments and Support Services and prepared a comprehensive Internal Academic Audit Report for the Academic Year 2025–26.

During the academic year 2025-26, all Academic Departments and Support Services actively participated in a wide range of curricular, co-curricular and extra-curricular activities and events. The contributions made by the Academic Departments and Support Services are highly commendable. This report, however, presents only the most significant and impactful initiatives undertaken during the said period.

External Academic Audit Report

Internal Quality Assurance Cell (IQAC)

The Internal Quality Assurance Cell (IQAC) of Islamiah College (Autonomous) has conducted Orientation Programme to Students and organized FDPs. The following are the important initiatives and programmes organized by the IQAC:

- ✓ The Internal Quality Assurance Cell (IQAC) of the College organized a Three Days Orientation cum Induction Programme to First Year UG Students during June 2025.
- ✓ The Internal Quality Assurance Cell (IQAC) organized a Five-Day Faculty Development Programme (FDP) in collaboration with the School of Social Sciences & Languages, Vellore Institute of Technology (VIT), Vellore, from 11th to 18th August 2025 on the theme 'Innovative Teaching Pedagogies in the 21st Century'. The programme commenced with an inaugural session at VIT, featuring Inaugural Session and Felicitations Addresses by distinguished academicians of VIT, followed by expert lectures on AI and language learning. The second to fourth days were conducted online at Islamiah College (Autonomous), with sessions on 'Ethical Concerns of AI', 'Bite-Sized Learning', 'Digital Classroom Redesign' and 'Technology-Enhanced Blended Learning'. The programme concluded on 18th August 2025 with an offline session at Islamiah College (Autonomous), Vaniyambadi, with a Lecture on 'Education 5.0' and a Valedictory Function where certificates were distributed to 25 participating faculty members.
- ✓ The Internal Quality Assurance Cell (IQAC) organized a Six-Day Faculty Development Programme (FDP) on the theme 'Quality Enhancement in Teaching, Learning, Evaluation and Research' from 26th March to 7th April 2026 at Soft Skills Development Centre, Department of Commerce, Islamiah College (Autonomous), Vaniyambadi. On 26th March 2026, Dr. Shaik Khader Nawaz, Vice Principal & IQAC Coordinator, addressed the participants on the 'Role of Learning in Educational Quality Enhancement' and on 27th March 2026, Dr. T. Afsar Basha, Principal & HOD of Commerce, addressed the participants on the 'Role of Teaching in Educational Quality Enhancement'. Dr. T. Mohamed Ilyas, Former Principal, delivered a presentation on 'Service Rules' and Dr. Syed Tahir Hussainy, Vice Principal (Admin.), addressed the participants on 'Leave Rules, Calculation of EL & Income Tax'. Prof. S. Md. Naseruddeen, Controller of Examinations, enlightened the participants on the 'Role of Evaluation in Educational Quality Enhancement' and Dr. S.U. Md. Riyaz, IQAC Member, delivered a presentation outlining the criteria for enhancing Research Quality.

Activities of Academic Departments

Curriculum Design and Development

The 21st Board of Studies Meeting was held on 24.01.2026 to approve the new structure and syllabus for the First Year Undergraduate and Postgraduate programmes for the academic year 2026–27. The Academic Departments of the College, through their respective Boards of Studies constituted as per the recommendations of the Affiliating University, designed the curriculum under the Choice Based Credit System (CBCS) and Outcome Based Education (OBE) aligning with NEP 2020. The syllabi have been revised and updated to incorporate skill development, emerging trends & advancements and the evolving needs of industry. The guidelines and recommendations of TANSCHÉ were followed by all departments while designing the curriculum. The adopted course structure comprises Skill Enhancement Courses, Ability Enhancement Courses, Elective Based Courses, Project Work and Industrial Training/Internship Programmes for all UG and PG programmes.

To promote self-learning & digital literacy, SWAYAM, Naan Mudhalvan and other online MOOCs courses have been made mandatory for all UG and PG students. In addition, courses on Indian Knowledge System (IKS) have been introduced across all UG and PG programmes. Value-based courses are offered by the Department of English for all UG departments in the College. In accordance with the recommendations of TANSCHÉ, several new and innovative courses have been partially incorporated into the curriculum.

- 35 Cadets attended the 'C' Certificate Examination at Vellore Institute of Technology on 14 & 15.02.2026 and 44 Cadets attended the 'B' Certificate Examination at Voorhees College, Vellore on 21 & 22.02.2026.
- 5 Cadets attended an Army Attachment Camp at Secunderabad from 02.03.2026 to 11.03.2026.

6. Red Ribbon Club (RRC)

The Red Ribbon Club organized several awareness and service activities during 2025–2026. An HIV/AIDS and STI awareness programme was conducted on 23.08.2025 and 88 students enrolled as new members. An orientation programme was held on 11.12.2025, and a Blood Donation Camp on 23.12.2025 saw active student participation. A “Celebrating Life Curriculum” programme was conducted on 06.01.2026, and volunteers also attended a training programme at Thiruvalluvar University on 10.03.2026.

A programme on “Job Opportunities in Air Force” was conducted on 03.07.2025 with 134 participants. District Job Fairs were held on 05.07.2025 and 20.12.2025 with large participation and significant selections. Campus recruitment drives were conducted on 06.03.2026 (Muthoot Finance) and 07.03.2026 (Jothi Software Pvt. Ltd.), where many students were selected, providing valuable employment opportunities.

13. Youth Red Cross (YRC)

The Youth Red Cross organized a Blood Donation Camp on 23.12.2025 in association with Government Hospital, Vaniyambadi. The programme emphasized the importance of voluntary blood donation and students actively participated, contributing to a humanitarian cause.

14. Skill Development Committee

The Skill Development Committee conducted a workshop on Mushroom Cultivation on 16.07.2025. Around 50 students participated and gained practical knowledge on cultivation techniques, environmental requirements, and business opportunities, encouraging entrepreneurial skills.

15. Yuva Tourism Club

The Yuva Tourism Club observed National Tourism Day on 22.01.2026 with the theme "Tourism and Green Growth." Various competitions like essay writing, speech and drawing were conducted, promoting awareness on eco-friendly tourism and environmental conservation among students.

16. Student Health and Welfare Committee

The Committee organized a Blood Group Screening Camp on 29.08.2025, where 130 students identified their blood groups. A Free Eye Screening Camp was also conducted on 28–29.08.2025 with participation of 484 students and staff, creating awareness on health and early detection of vision problems.

17. Anti-Drug Awareness Committee

The Anti-Drug Awareness Committee conducted various programmes throughout the year, including competitions, rallies, pledge campaigns and awareness sessions. Important events focusing on educating students and the public about the harmful effects of drug abuse and promoting a drug-free society were held on 08.08.2025, 11.08.2025, 10.09.2025, 14.10.2025 and January 2026.
