15. Multidisciplinary / interdisciplinary

Islamiah College offers 14 Undergraduate Programmes and 6 Postgraduate Programmes in addition to 9 Ph.D Programmes. in Arts, Humanities and Science. In addition to a variety of undergraduate and postgraduate programs, the institution offers a comprehensive range of Value Added/Skill Developing Courses to fulfill the demands of local, national, and global organizations and society. The institution effectively adopted the Choice Based Credit System (CBCS) and began offering its many components, such as allied courses, non-major courses, elective courses, optional courses, etc., immediately after acquiring autonomy. Science Departments offer allied/interdisciplinary courses in other departments and similarly, Arts and Humanities Departments offer Computer Courses to its students. The College offers as many as 20 Skill Developing Value Added Courses to diversify and enrich curriculum and also enhance employment/entrepreneurship opportunities. Most of the Skill Developing Courses are offered by one Department to other Department Students.

16.Academic bank of credits (ABC):

The College has already registered itself for Academic Bank of Credits (ABC) in February 2023. The Students' Mentors were trained and instructed by the ABC Nodal Officer to encourage and assist students to register in DigiLocker and generate ABC IDs. Several training sessions were conducted for students as well. Many students have already registered in DigiLocker and uploaded their credits.

17.Skill development:

The main objective of Islamiah College is to assist students in

acquiring a range of skills that will increase their prospects of getting a job or starting their own company. As a result, at each Board of Studies meeting, regulations and curricula are carefully created to incorporate extra skill-building courses, and these are taught in all degree programs. Industrial visits and hands-on trainings are provided to students to expose them to real-world experience. While all undergraduate and postgraduate programs place a great deal of emphasis on skill-developing courses by adding more skill-developing subjects, the college also introduced special valueadded courses to support students' skill development. Up to 20 Skill Developing Value Added Certificate Courses are currently offered by the College, and they include Certificate Course in Spoken English, Mushroom Cultivation, Herbal Medicine, Preparation of Domestic Products, Testing and Analysis of Industrial Products, Online Trading of Securities etc., focusing on Developing Skills for Employability/Entrepreneurship.

18.Appropriate integration of Indian Knowledge system (teaching in Indian Language, culture, using online course)

Islamiah College has integrated Indian culture, languages, traditions and value systems in its curriculum. Indian languages are taught in three departments at Islamiah College viz., Department of Hindi, Department of Tamil, Department of Urdu & Arabic and First Year UG students can take foundation courses from any of the three departments. Department of History teaches to its students about the history of India, its constitution, its cultural heritage from the Middle Ages, its social and cultural history, the histories of ancient and modern civilizations etc. In an effort to enlighten students and raise awareness about Indian herbs and their medicinal value, the Department of Biotechnology offers a one-month Value Added Certificate Course on "Herbal Medicine." Mushroom Cultivation" is a Value Added Certificate Course offered by the Department of Biochemistry.

19. Focus on Outcome based education (OBE): Focus on Outcome based education (OBE):

As per NEP and LOCF guidelines, Graduate Attributes have been identified and Qualification Descriptors/Programme Outcomes (POS) for various branches of study have been clearly charted out. Programme Learning Outcomes/Programme Specific Outcomes (PSOs) for each individual Degree Programme have been drafted and the curriculum is carefully designed to meet the requirements of these PSOs. Mapping of the PSOs with POs have shown high levels of alignment. Course Learning Outcomes/Course Outcomes (COs) have been designed and Knowledge levels (as per Blooms Taxonomy) have been identified for all courses offered. The mapping of COs with PSOs

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have also been done to ensure that the COs help in attaining the POs. Attainment of COs has been assessed through carefully designed Creative Assignments modeled to assess the required knowledge in various domains of a course. Attainment of PSOs at the end of the Programme shall be assessed on the basis of attainment of COs of all Courses of a Programme. Attainment of POs shall be assessed through a Student Survey after two years of completion of their study. The POs, PSOs and COs have been approved by the Board of Studies and Academic Council and displayed on the college website, communicated to students during their Orientation Programme and at the start of each semester.

20.Distance education/online education:

From the Academic Year 2021-22, exams for few courses have been conducted through online. Islamiah College (Autonomous) has entered into a MoU with IIT Bombay for Spoken Tutorial Projects which is conducted through online. The College is a registered member of ICT Academy which offers courses through Blended Mode. As per the Regulation of Curriculum and Syllabi, all the undergraduate and postgraduate students have to complete at least one online MOOC course successfully.

2.2 - Catering to Student Diversity

2.2.1 - The institution assesses students' learning levels and organises special programmes for both slow and advanced learners.

Islamiah College (Autonomous), located in Vaniyambadi, attracts students from nearby villages, many with rural backgrounds. To help them adapt to college life and assess their learning levels, the Internal Quality Assurance Cell (IQAC) conducts an annual orientation program for first-year undergraduates. The Principal, Vice Principal, department heads, and coordinators of support services address and motivate students to utilize available infrastructure effectively. Departments also organize their own orientation programs to guide and clarify doubts. To address language challenges, the Department of English offers a Bridge Course in English. Remedial coaching classes are conducted for slow learners, while advanced learners receive special assignments and encouragement to participate in seminars, competitions, and competitive exams like UPSC, TNPSC, and NET/SET.

The curriculum integrates assignments, internships, field trips, and MOOC courses with defined grading systems. Elective and skill-based courses encourage active participation. MoUs for student exchange programs and workshops, seminars, and industry expert lectures expose students to diverse learning and industry trends.

Islamiah College emphasizes Information and Communication Technology (ICT) to create an engaging and effective learning environment. Over the past five years, ICT-enabled classrooms and tools have been prioritized. The campus is Wi-Fi-enabled, and all academic departments are equipped with computers, laptops, and internet access. Classrooms feature LCD projectors and screens, while labs are equipped with ICT tools to enhance experimental learning. Commerce and Management students benefit from a dedicated computer lab. The Virtual and Digital Library provides access to 77,00,000+ e-books, 6,000+ e-journals, and expert video lectures. During COVID-19, online platforms and hybrid teaching methods were adopted, including YouTube lectures, still utilized today.

A custom-built Education Management System (EMS) is hosted on a high-speed server connected through an intranet to the Administrative Office, Examination Cell, and Academic Departments. Staff and students access different modules via secure logins.

The software streamlines examination processes, ensuring accuracy and confidentiality. Students can access their exam forms, fee payment, attendance, hall tickets, seating arrangements, and results online. Internal assessment and attendance records are digitized for transparency. Dummy numbers ensure confidentiality during evaluations, and automated systems handle results, grade cards, and pass certificates with advanced security features. These reforms have enhanced the accuracy, speed, and reliability of examination procedures.

Course Outcomes (COs) were created for each course, aligning with POs and PSOs, using measurable active verbs as per Bloom's taxonomy.

These outcomes were finalized during Board of Studies meetings, involving subject experts, university nominees, industrialists, alumni, and students, and later approved by the Academic Council. POs, PSOs and COs are displayed online through website, Course Outcomes are included in syllabi and shared with students in the beginning of each semester.

All science research departments have dedicated laboratories, including access to the DST-FIST Lab, equipped with advanced tools for research. The college allocates funds to upgrade these labs, purchase modern equipment, and renovate facilities, such as the recently updated Biochemistry lab.

The college follows a well-defined research promotion policy published on its website. Faculty publishing in Scopus/Web of Science/UGC Care Listed Journals or authoring books receive recognition certificates on College Day. Faculty pursuing Ph.D. programs benefit from fee concessions of up to ?10,000 for three years. Ph.D. supervisors are encouraged to prioritize mentoring department staff, while all faculty members are motivated to apply for research projects and attend workshops. Staff Members are recognized during Annual Day or Management-Staff Meetings for securing funded projects. The college promotes quality research through plagiarism checks and incentives for research guides.

Industry-academia collaborations address local challenges, supported by multiple MoUs and active participation from leather industry leaders. The Entrepreneurship Development & Innovation & Incubation Cell of the College regularly organizes guest lectures and seminars. The Faculty Members of the College have obtained 5 Patents during the Academic Year 2023-24 alone which underscores the thriving research environment of the College.

Islamiah College offers extensive infrastructure and facilities to provide a student-centric and technology-enabled environment. The 42-acre campus includes 17,736 square meters of built-up area, featuring an Administrative Block, Academic Blocks, Library, Virtual Library with SWAYAM access, laboratories, an indoor stadium, seminar halls, canteen, and swimming pool.

Key facilities include:

- ICT-enabled classrooms, seminar hall, multimedia hall, and auditorium
- A spacious, fully automated library with 85,000+ books, 125 periodicals, 7.7 million e-books, and 6,000 e-journals
- Language lab, virtual library, and digital library
- 12 well-equipped science labs, DST-FIST, and DBT-sponsored labs
- 5 computer labs for academics, plus a dedicated commerce lab
- High-end ICT-enabled labs with 450+ computers (410 for academics)
- 100 Mbps internet and campus Wi-Fi
- Recreational facilities: gym, indoor stadium, swimming pool, and playground
- Additional amenities: book house, canteen, bank, safe drinking water, and 24/7 CCTV surveillance.

Islamiah College boasts an extensive 30-acre playground equipped with state-of-the-art facilities to host multiple games simultaneously, including hockey, football, cricket, tennis, shuttlecock, basketball, kabaddi, and kho-kho. The campus features a dedicated indoor stadium, a state-of-the-art swimming pool, and a multipurpose gymnasium with advanced fitness equipment like arm curl machines, bench presses, exercise cycles, and more. The gym

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and swimming pool, closed during the COVID-19 pandemic, have been reopened following government approval.

The college also houses a 1,000-seat auditorium, a 200-seat air-conditioned seminar hall, and a 100-seat multimedia hall for academic, cultural, and competitive events. The annual cultural fest, IGNITE, is a highlight, alongside indoor and outdoor games organized by the Department of Physical Education.

The examination process is fully automated, and 60+ CCTV cameras enhance campus security. The library offers INFLIBNET, DELNET, a digital library, and a virtual library. 4.4.2 - There are established systems and procedures for maintaining and utilizing physical, academic and support facilities – classrooms, laboratory, library, sports complex, computers, etc.

Each year, the Secretary and Correspondent of Islamiah College plan for construction/extension/renovation and strengthen infrastructure, with approval from the Managing Committee. Timetables of UG and PG programmes are prepared to optimize the use of teaching and learning facilities. A team of 14 sweepers, 2 scavengers, and 2 gardeners maintain campus cleanliness and the gardens under supervision.

Computer maintenance is handled by a technician, while software upkeep is managed by i-Grapix Solutions, Chennai. Lab Assistants oversee Science and Computer labs, adhering to Standard Operating Procedures (SOPs). Major lab repairs are handled by expert technicians from Chennai and Vellore. An electrician and plumber regularly monitor electrical and plumbing systems.

The library, supported by five staff members, ensures smooth operations. Facilities like the swimming pool, indoor stadium, gymnasium, auditorium, seminar hall, multimedia room, and smart room are well-maintained. The college publishes the Islamiah College User Manual for library guidance and contracts out canteen and book house services. Solar panels on the administrative building are managed by an external company. The fire extinguishers have been installed with the required instructions at the important locations and are maintained in accordance with the rules and regulations.

The College Committee, constituted triennially, includes the Secretary and Correspondent, 14 society members, and the Principal as an exofficio member.

Governed by the Tamil Nadu Private College Regulation Act, 1976, the College Committee oversees staff appointments and governance, adhering to UGC, Government, and guidelines of Regulatory Authorities. Recruitment follows merit-based selection, supported

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by necessary approvals. Staff benefits, promotions, and leave policies comply with Tamil Nadu service rules, and a code of conduct governs all employees.

Islamiah College (Autonomous), Vaniyambadi, conducts regular internal and external financial audits to ensure smooth operations and financial accountability.

Internal audits are carried out by qualified faculty members appointed by the college management. Departments and Support Services submit budget proposals for events to the Principal and Secretary for approval. Once approved, expenditures are audited with original bills and vouchers by the Internal Auditors.

External audits involve two processes: (1) Annual Government Audits by the Joint Director of Collegiate Education and periodic reviews by the Accountant General, ensuring proper justification for audit objections and settlement of UGC accounts; (2) A Management-constituted Accounts Audit Committee, comprising senior auditors, reviews and audits all accounts annually. Reports are submitted to the Executive Committee and General Body for approval and communicated to the Registrar of Societies. Additionally, other payments are managed via PFMS and IFHRMS systems.

Islamiah College (Autonomous) employs an effective strategy and robust system for fund mobilization and optimal utilization, overseen by the Finance Committee. Headed by the Principal and Secretary & Correspondent, with members including the Controller of Examinations, a Chartered Accountant, and a Finance Officer from the University, the committee prepares an annual Budgeted Income and Expenditure Account, which is reviewed and approved in Finance Committee and Governing Body meetings. Accounts are duly audited by the Chartered Accountant.

Key strategies include:

- Salaries: Government funds salaries for aided staff, while salaries of unaided staff members are met through the tuition fees collected from the students of self-financed programs.
- Scholarships: The College facilitates government scholarships for BC/SC/ST/Minority students and also provides financial assistance to students through its own Scholarship, Students Aid Fund and NGOs Scholarship.
- Alumni Contributions: The registered Alumni Association provides funds and the same is audited annually.
- Sponsorships: Departments/Support Services secure sponsorships for seminars/conferences which are duly audited.

Trash is sorted into biodegradable and non-biodegradable categories, with bins placed across the campus, including the canteen. Vermicomposting is used to convert organic waste into fertilizer, promoting soil fertility. Burning waste is strictly prohibited to maintain carbon neutrality.

Liquid waste from labs is filtered, treated for pH, COD, and BOD levels, and recycled through an RO system for gardening.

e-Waste, including electronics, is handled by Tritech Systems, an authorized dealer, under an MoU, ensuring safe disposal.

Biomedical waste is sterilized or destroyed using appropriate instruments.
