

INTERNAL ACADEMIC AUDIT REPORT 2024-2025

The Internal Quality Assurance Cell (IQAC), Islamiah College (Autonomous), Vaniyambadi has started the practice of conducting Internal Academic Audit (IAA) since the Academic Year 2014-15. Dr. K. Anandaratchagan, Head & Associate Professor of Chemistry and Dr. V. Mahmudul Hasan, Assistant Professor of Commerce, were appointed as Internal Academic Auditors for the Academic Year 2024-25. The present IAA report has been prepared by Internal Auditors for the Academic Year 2024-25 (from 01.06.2024 to 01.04.2025) covering, two semesters of the academic year. This IAA report is submitted as per the IQAC criteria encompassing all important parameters. The IAA was conducted on 3rd and 4th April 2025.

During the Internal Academic Audit, the Internal Auditors personally visited all the Academic Departments and Units of Students Support Services to verify the records and collected the required information through the reports submitted by the Heads of the Departments and Staff Member In-charge for the Student Support Services. Academic Departments and Units of Students Support Services have carried out various activities and they are documented by the departments and support services. On the basis of the information provided to the internal auditors, after thorough verification of records this report is presented here very briefly in two parts. The first part covers the activities of Academic Departments and the second part is about the activities carried out by the Units of Students Support Services during the Academic Year 2024-25.

1. INNOVATIONS IN CURRICULUM DESIGN

Every Academic department in the college through the board of studies formed as per the recommendations of the affiliating university designs its curriculum based on Choice Based Credit System (CBCS) and the syllabus is revised periodically through the Board of Studies by each and every department. In the academic year 2024-25 the recommendations of TANSCHÉ is followed by all the departments in designing the curriculum and for the approval of new syllabus for the second year, the meeting of the 19th Board of Studies was conducted on 02.05.2024. The course structure includes Skill Enhancement Courses, Ability Enhancement Courses, Elective Based Courses, project work, industrial training/internship programme for all the UG and PG programmes. SWAYAM / NAAN Mudhalvan/ Online Courses MOOC are made compulsory for all the students of UG and PG Programmes. Value based courses are offered by the Department of English for all the UG Departments in the College. The new courses recommended by TANSCHÉ are also included and the details of innovative courses introduced for the second year UG and PG Programmes are given below.

Practical exercises, including mock interviews and email drafting, were conducted to enhance learning.

Students found the session immensely beneficial as it bridged the gap between academic learning and workplace communication. The event concluded with an interactive Q&A session, followed by a vote of thanks from faculty members.

The Skill Development Committee's initiative was highly appreciated, and students expressed interest in attending more such sessions in the future.

18. YOVA TOURISM CLUB (YTC)

1. VISIT TO GOA (08.01.2025 to 12-01-2025)

The YUVA Tourism Club (YTC) of our College organized a tour for Undergraduate Students from various streams, scheduled from 8th to 12th January 2025, to Goa. The tour was conducted in accordance with the guidelines provided by the Regional Joint Director, Vellore. A group of 20 students participated in the tour, accompanied by 3 staff members and 1 attender. The students gathered at Vaniyambadi Railway Station at 9:30 a.m. on 8th January 2025 and departed for Goa by train. They arrived safely in Goa at 6:00 a.m. on 9th January 2025.

First Day (09-01-2025)

Sinquerim Fort

The Sinquerim Fort is located at a distance of 18 kms from Panaji. The fort stands overlooking the Sinquerim beach and bisects the shoreline into two. This fort was constructed in the year 1612. There is an extension of the larger upper Aguada fort. The lower fort consists of a bastion and a section of fortified wall on both sides. During the 16th and 17th Century, ships used to anchor next to the fort.

Fort Aguada

Fort Aguada, a 17th-century Portuguese fort in Goa, overlooks Sinquerim Beach and the Arabian Sea. Built in 1612 to guard against Dutch invasions, it also served as a navigation point for European ships. The fort, an ASI-protected

Monument of National Importance, features one of Asia's oldest lighthouses, built in 1864, with a bell retrieved from St. Augustine's Monastery in Old Goa. Students explored its rich history, marvelled at the architecture, and enjoyed stunning sea views, creating a perfect blend of learning and fun.

Calangute Beach

Calangute Beach, famously known as the Queen of Beaches, is one of Goa's most popular and vibrant destinations, located just nine miles from Panaji. Known for its palm-fringed shores, bustling nightlife, and thrilling watersports like parasailing and jet-skiing, it's a hub of activity. Surrounded by Candolim to the south and Baga to the north, the beach offers a mix of adventure, relaxation, and cultural charm with its souvenir stalls and shacks. Students explored the beach's lively atmosphere, learned about Goa's coastal culture, and enjoyed watersports and the serene beauty of the Arabian Sea, making it a memorable and enriching experience.

Candolim Beach

One of the longest beaches in Goa, Candolim Beach is also sometimes called the gateway to the other popular beaches in the state. The beach that begins from Fort Aguada is comparatively quieter and perfect for lazing, though for watersports lovers, there are some activities like parasailing and water skiing.

Beach Cleaning Activity

The Members of YUVA Tourism Club of Islamiah College were taken to the Candolim beach in Goa for "Beach Clean Up Drive". 20 volunteers of YTC and Four staff coordinators participated in the drive. Garbage bags were bought prior to the clean-up. We reported at the beach at 5:00 pm. Firstly all the students were provided gloves and masks for their safety. Then we started to clean the beach. All the members were working with great dedication. Due to that dedication we were able to

complete our agenda. As soon as the gloves and the masks were received, the YTC unit started their work of cleaning the beach. The YTC Coordinators visited the location and appreciated the members for their hard work, determination and dedication towards the aim to make the environment clean.

Second Day (10-01-2025)

CSIR - National Institute of Oceanography (NIO)

On 10.01.2025, Students and Staff members visited the National Institute of Oceanography (NIO), a renowned multidisciplinary oceanographic research institute. Known for its focus on the Indian Ocean, the NIO has contributed over 5,000 research articles and houses 200 scientists and 100 technical staff. Its research spans biological, chemical, geological, and physical oceanography, as well as ocean engineering and marine archaeology. Students made the visit productive by engaging with experts, gaining insights into cutting-edge oceanographic research, and exploring the Institute's to marine science.

Dolphin Ride - Miramar Beach

The Emerald Coast's Miramar Beach offers breathtaking views, vibrant sea life, and the magical Olin Marler dolphin tour. This adventure provides a unique opportunity to observe playful bottlenose dolphins in their natural Gulf of Mexico habitat. Students gained knowledge about marine life and dolphin behavior, enhancing their understanding of ocean ecosystems while creating unforgettable memories.

Mandovi River Cruise

Students embarked on a scenic river cruise along the Mandovi River from the Santa Monica jetty in Panaji. They enjoyed vibrant music, folk dance performances, and a live band, along with stunning sunset views. The cruise offered glimpses of the

historic Adil Shah Palace, colonial buildings, Mormugao Port, and Fort Aguada, blending relaxation with a journey through Goa's rich heritage. Students learned about Goa's history and culture while enjoying an immersive and lively Goan experience.

Third Day (11-01-2025)

Basilica of Bom Jesus (UNESCO World Heritage site)

The Basilica of Bom Jesus, built in 1605 AD, is home to the tomb of St. Francis Xavier and showcases classic Jesuit architecture. Its interior features a floor-to-ceiling screen with an image of St. Ignatius Loyola protecting the infant Jesus. Students grasped the historical and architectural significance of the basilica, learning about its religious importance and the legacy of St. Francis Xavier in Goa's cultural history.

Archaeological Museum and Portrait Gallery

The Archaeological Museum in Old Goa, overseen by the Archaeological Survey of India, features exhibits spanning Goa's history from the Portuguese colonial era to prehistoric times. Key displays include sculptures, weapons, inscriptions, and portraits of colonial figures, along with a notable statue of poet Luis Vaz de Camoes. Students gained insights into Goa's cultural evolution, the impact of Portuguese rule, and the region's rich historical artifacts, enhancing their understanding of its past.

Sahakari Spice Farm The farm, established in 1979/80, covers 4.5 Ha of cultivated and 55 Ha of barren land. It uses a mix of scientific methods, such as sprinkler irrigation, and traditional farming techniques for water conservation. Visitors learn about the medicinal and culinary uses of spices, while the farm also serves as a research center for students and farmers. Students gained valuable insights

into sustainable farming, the practical uses of spices in health and diet, and the importance of water conservation in agriculture.

Colva Beach

Colva Beach, situated 6 km from Margao in South Goa, stretches 2.4 km along the Arabian Sea. Famous for its white sands and water sports, it's a popular spot near other attractions like Panaji and Old Goa. Students relished the vibrant beach activities, enjoying water sports and soaking in the beauty of the coastline, making it an enriching experience. Our tour concluded with our departure from Goa on the evening of 11th January 2025, and we safely returned to our college on 12th January 2025.

2. BEACH CLEANING DRIVE @ MARINA, CHENNAI on 25-02-2025

The YUVA Tourism Club (YTC) of our College organized a one day visit for Undergraduate Students on 25th February 2025, to Chennai. The visit was conducted in accordance with the guidelines provided by the Regional Joint Director, Vellore. A group of 51 students participated in the visit, accompanied by 2 staff members and 1 attender. The students gathered at Islamiah College (Autonomous) at 10:00 p.m. on 24th February 2025 and departed for Chennai by Bus. They arrived safely in Chennai at 5:00 a.m. on 25th February 2025.

The YUVA Tourism Club of Islamiah College (Autonomous), Vaniyambadi, in its commitment to environmental sustainability and community service, organized a Beach Cleaning Drive at Marina Beach, Chennai. The event aimed to promote eco-tourism, raise awareness about marine pollution, and foster a sense of responsibility towards nature among Students and the general public. The drive saw enthusiastic participation from students, and faculty members who joined hands to restore the beauty of one of India's most famous beaches.

Objectives of the Drive

The main objectives of the Beach Cleaning Drive were:

1. To create awareness about the adverse effects of marine pollution.

3. To remove litter and non-biodegradable waste from Marina Beach.

Planning and Coordination

Pre-event Preparation

The event was planned over a month, with careful coordination of YUVA Tourism Club. Permissions and Approvals: Necessary approvals were obtained from Regional Joint Director of Collegiate Education, Vellore. Logistics Arrangement: Gloves, garbage bags, Masks, and safety equipment were arranged. Over 50 students from Islamiah College (Autonomous). Two Faculty members and One Non-Teaching staff. The Beach Cleaning Drive was conducted on February 25, 2025, from 7:00 AM to 8:00 AM. The activities included: YUVA Tourism Club Members assembled at a designated meeting point near Marina Beach. A briefing session was conducted by Dr. M. A. Farook, Coordinator, YUVA Tourism Club to educate participants on safe waste disposal and the impact of marine pollution. Teams were divided into groups, each assigned a specific section of the beach. YTC Members picked up plastic waste, glass bottles, cigarette butts, and food wrappers. Segregation of waste into biodegradable and non-biodegradable categories was done. Waste was packed in biodegradable bags and collected at designated points. Special attention was given to fishing nets and synthetic debris to prevent harm to marine life.

Waste Disposal

Chennai Corporation provided support in transporting collected waste to recycling centers. Non-recyclable waste was disposed of in government-approved dumping zones. The Beach Cleaning Drive had a significant impact:

1. Approximately 200 kg of waste was collected and disposed of responsibly.

19. INTELLECTUAL PROPERTY RIGHTS CELL (IPR CELL)

PR Cell of Islamiah College (Autonomous) organized One Day Workshop on IPR and Patents, Designs Process and Filing to Faculty members, Researchers and Students of science disciplines on 06th February 2025 in the Seminar Hall. Mr. A. Raja, Deputy Controller of Patents, Patent Office, Chennai was the resource person. He gave a holistic view of IPR and its related features. Later he demonstrated the various level of IPR, Patents and Designs. A total of 165 participants got benefitted.

Intellectual property rights (IPR) are the legal privileges granted to the inventor or creator to safeguard their intellectual work in the arts, sciences, literature, etc. for a specific period of time. These legal rights grant the inventor or creator, or

his assignee, the sole right to fully exploit their invention or creation for a specific amount of time. These Intellectual property rights are outlined in Article 27 of the Universal Declaration of Human Rights, which grants the right to gain protection for one's material and moral interests as a result of the authorship of works of science, literature, or the arts.

The World Intellectual Property Organization (WIPO) annually publishes the *World Intellectual Property Indicators* (WIPI) report, which provides a comprehensive analysis of global trends in intellectual property filings. The 2024 report highlights the growth and evolution of patents, trademarks, and industrial designs across key global economies, with particular attention to emerging markets and innovation hubs. India has solidified its position as a global leader in intellectual property filings, securing a spot in the top 10 countries for patents, trademarks, and industrial designs. This achievement underscores India's growing innovation capacity, with the country making remarkable strides in patent applications, brand protection, and design innovations. One of the most remarkable findings in the 2024 report is India's exceptional performance in the global IP landscape. India recorded a phenomenal +15.7% growth in patent applications in 2023, continuing its streak of double-digit growth for the fifth consecutive year. This surge places India among the top countries contributing to global patent filings, signaling the country's increasing role as a global innovation hub. The resilience of IP filings during the COVID-19 crisis further underscores the enduring importance of intellectual property in driving economic recovery and growth.

India now ranks 6th globally in terms of patent applications, with 64,480 patent filings in 2023. This puts India among the leading nations, including China, the United States, Japan, and South Korea, in terms of intellectual property activity.

India's rise in global patent rankings is particularly notable given its vast and diverse economy, ranging from traditional sectors like agriculture to cutting-edge industries like pharmaceuticals, information technology, and renewable energy.

India also saw a 149.4% increase in the number of patents granted in 2023 compared to the previous year. This rapid growth in granted patents underscores the efficiency of India's patent office in processing applications and granting IP rights. It also reflects the rising quality of applications being filed, with many innovations meeting global standards. This progress signifies India's growing maturity as a hub for technological and scientific development.

IPR cell of our College feels proud for its contribution for the growth of India by obtaining Patents for Seven Industrial Designs.

With this backdrop, IPR cell of our College organized One Day Workshop IPR – Patents and Designs process to create awareness on IPR and its significance to research supervisors, research scholars and postgraduate students on 6th February 2025 at 11.00 am in Seminar Hall.

The programme commenced with prayer. Mr. Waheed (PhD research scholar) recited few verses from the holy Quran, followed by Thamilthai Vazhthu. Dr. H. Abdul Jaffar Ali, Coordinator, IPR - Cell, Associate Professor and Head, Dept. of Biotechnology welcomed the august gathering.

Dr. T. Afsar Basha, Principal delivered a presidential address. In his speech, he emphasized the importance of converting the research outcomes into patents and protecting the intellectuals.

Dr. Shaik Khadar Nawaz, Vice Principal and IQAC coordinator, in his felicitation address, he motivated students and quoted very simplest examples from the day to day life for getting patents. Guest Speaker Mr. A. Raja, Deputy Controller

of Patents, Patent Office, Chennai delivered a special lecture on IPR and demonstrated the various form of patents and its process and filing.

Subsequently he explained about IPR, its significance, most common mistakes by Inventors, inventive step, the process of filing the Patent application, patent grant procedure and role of IPRs/ patent system. In conclusion, a formal vote of thanks was proposed by Dr. Mr. Mohammed Altaf II M.Sc. Biotechnology. Finally the programme was ended with National Anthem.
