The Internal Quality Assurance Cell (IQAC), Islamiah College (Autonomous) Vaniyambadi has started the practice of conducting Internal Academic Audit (IAA) from the Academic Year 2014 -15. Dr. K.Anandaratchagan, Associate Professor of Chemistry and Dr. T.Afsar Basha, Associate Professor of Commerce have been appointed as Internal Auditors from the Academic Year 2018 -19. The present IAA report has been prepared by Internal Auditors for the period 01-06-2019 to 31-05-2020 covering two semesters of this Academic Year. The Internal Academic Audit report has been submitted as per the IQAC criteria encompassing all important academic parameters. The IAA was conducted on 24thSeptember 2020. During the IAA, internal auditors personally visited all Departments, verified the records, collected all required information from the respective Departments. On the basis of this Internal Audit, reports of each department and the student support services functioning in the College is presented very briefly.

The College has established several support services for the upliftment of student community, which enable them to improve their knowledge and acquire soft skills in various fields of extra curricular activities. A brief report of the activities carried out by the support services during academic year 2019-2020 is presented below.

INTERNAL QUALITY ASSURANCE CELL (IOAC)

Internal Quality Assurance Cell (IQAC) plays a significant role in maintaining and sustaining the quality of education in any institution. The IQAC of our college is no exception Rin pushing for the quality standards in various academic activities. The role and function of Islamiah College IQAC is evident in each of its varied activities such as conducting IQAC meetings, organizing orientation programmes for students and staff, conducting of Internal and External Academic Audit, ensuring compliance to rules, regulations and amendments of various regulatory bodies etc. The Annual Report consisting of significant activities of IQAC for the Academic Year 2019-20 is enlisted herewith.

IQAC Meeting with HODs on 16.07.2019

On 16th July, 2019, the Internal Quality Assurance Cell (IQAC) organized a meeting with all HODs, NAAC Steering and Working Committee. The agenda of the meeting was to discuss and deliberate on Programme Outcomes, Programme Specific Outcomes and Course Outcomes and also to discuss on updation and submission of SSR to NAAC.

On 8th September, 2019, all the Head of the Departments gave a detailed PPT Presentation in the Seminar Hall, to the External Academic Auditors, Management Members, Principal and IQAC Coordinator, with regard to their Department's Contribution in imparting Quality Education and Development of College in the form of Quantitative and Qualitative Metrics.

On 9th September, 2019, External Academic Auditors along with Dr. T. Mohamed Ilyas, Principal & Associate Professor and Dr. S. Raja Md. Kamil, Vice Principal & IQAC Coordinator, visited all the Academic Departments, Library and other Support Service Cells of our College.

An Exit Meeting was conducted on the same day in the Seminar Hall at 4 pm. External Academic Auditors suggested various measures for enhancing and sustaining quality of education. 112 staff members attended the meeting.

The IQAC organized an Interactive Meeting of all HODs on 14.10.2019 regarding NAAC preparations and quality enhancement measures. ACADEMIC ACTIVITIES OF DEPARTMENTS

Islamiah College (Autonomous) Vaniyambadi affiliated to Thiruvalluvar University, Serkkadu, Vellore offers 6 UG & 2 PG programs in science, 4 UG & 1 PG programs in commerce and 1UG & 1 PG program in humanities. Being a government aided college, it offers 4 UG & 4 PG programs in science ,1 UG program in commerce and 1 UG & 1 PG program in humanities by self-financing mode. Choice based credit system (CBCS) is followed in all the programs offered by the college. Courses focusing on employability and skill development is offered by the science departments. The college traditionally offering commerce programs now offers courses to promote entrepreneurship through the various commerce related programs. To sustain all these activities syllabus revision by all the departments is done in a cyclical manner. Board of studies meeting was conducted on 10.10.2019 by all the departments to carry out the syllabus revision for the third year UG (5th & 6th Semesters) of all the programs. The list of courses focussing on employability/entrepreneurship /skill development and list of courses for which syllabus revision has been carried out is furnished by all the departments in their report for the academic year 2019-2020. New programs are also introduced in the academic year 2019-20. Additional section in B.Sc Chemistry by the department of chemistry is done through selffinancing mode. The number of new courses offered by the department is given in detail in the report submitted to the internal academic auditors. Certificate courses or value-added courses are offered to impart skills for the better future of the students. The courses are periodically revised and the data pertaining to the courses offered during the year 2019-20 is given below

Teaching -learning & Evaluation

The college receives the salary for 76 teachers from the government and 35 teachers are paid by the management. The vacancies in teaching posts caused by the retirement of staff members or by other means are filled by management immediately.

Information and communication technology-based learning activities are encouraged by the management of Islamiah College and facilities are given to all the departments to provide eresources to all the students to support the learning process. The details given by the departments reveals the existence of effective learning managements system in the college.

The teachers of Islamiah College are recognised well by the Universities and colleges around Vaniyambadi due to their experience in academic and research activities. The staff members

play an effective role as members in board of studies (BOS), doctoral committees, external examiners in M.Phil and Ph.D viva voces ,examiner in service commission examinations conducted by state and central governments (TNPSC & UPSC), chairpersons, resource person in various program like seminars, conferences and workshops etc.

Institutional Values & Best Practices

Vaniyambadi a town located on the Chennai-Bangalore national highway is known for leather industries. The VMES society found by philanthropists of Vaniyambadi is managing Islamiah College to serve the students from Vaniyambadi and also the students from the economically backward rural areas in and around the town. The management encourages the faculty members to render their services to the public by taking advantage of inclusion and situatedness of this institution.

The department of biochemistry has conducted a hands on training program on 'Mushroom Cultivation' for one day on 23.01.2020 in the department of biochemistry by inviting the people from nearby villages. The department of computer science has conducted a one day program on 'Digital Ethics' on 19.12.2019 to 295 participants for promoting values and ethics in a digital world and social media. The department of English offers a course in 'Value Education' to the students of Islamiah college. The department of B.com (FA) has conducted a one day program on 04.02.2020 for 126 participants in which 'Principles, Products and Practices of Islamic Banking & Finance' is explained. A one day orientation program on 'Indian Constitution and equal opportunities' conducted by the department of history is attended by 150 participants. The college offers courses on Hindi, Urdu and Arabic in addition to English and Tamil. The services rendered by the various departments of languages are appreciated by the public since they are highly useful for the student community to promote a good socio, economic and religious culture. The best practices of the departments are given in the annual report along with their future plan.

ACTIVITIES OF SUPPORT SERVICES

CONTROLLER OF EXAMINATIONS (COE) OFFICE

The Office of the Controller of Examinations is spacious, air-conditioned, and has a large amount of storage capacity to store papers and other examination material. The office also has an attached strong room to maintain the confidentiality of question papers. The office of the Controller of Examinations was established in September 2010, soon after the College obtained its autonomous status from the UGC. The examination department has been working independently for the conduct of Autonomous Examinations. The Information Technology (IT) integration in the COE office has facilitates all modules of examinations process starting with online application download to final mark sheet printing.

The Responsibilities of the office are:

- Preparing academic calendar which includes all the academic related activities
- Conducting CIA Tests and the End Semester Autonomous Examinations
- · Processing and Publishing results in time.
- Issuing Certificates such Statement of Grade, Consolidated Statement of Grade and Transcript
- Sending a list of successful candidates with their CGPA and photo to Thiruvalluvar University for issuing Provisional and Degree Certificates.

Infrastructural support from the Management

The management has constructed and provided a new building exclusively for the department of examinations. The Office of the COE is fully computerized and equipped with the state-of-the-art technology infrastructure for its effective functioning. A following are equipment available in COE;

- High configuration Server and computers with LED monitors, which are kept away from access by outsiders to the office of the COE
- It has provided software support from iGrapix Solutions, Chennai, which supports all
 days (24x7) to manage the examination process. The system is secure and foolproof.
 Moreover, it has provided trained personnel who are able to exploit the system fully.
- Three large Laser Jet printers with A3 and A4 printing capability and Digital Stencil
 Copier for rapid printing of a large number of copies of question papers and
 examination related documents. High Speed Scanner to scan OMR sheets during
 centralized valuation process.
- An exclusive uninterruptible 10 KVA power supply (UPS) system with effective backup capacity
- Automatic backup system that keeps regular backups of all data, so that any loss due to technical disasters is negligible.

Functions of the office of the Controller of Examinations

The Office of the Controller of Examinations is an autonomous body with well-defined responsibilities and perform the following functions are

- Receives the Academic Council approved Regulations & Schemes of Examinations, and a copy of the Syllabi for all programmes from the Principal.
- Receives the Bio-Data forms of First year UG, PG and M.Phil students from the respective departments.

- Appoints question paper setters and receives question paper sets with key and detailed schemes of valuation.
- Conducts centralized CIA I & CIA II Tests for all programmes.
- Arranges for download of Semester Examination applications for UG, PG and M.Phil through students login facility.
- Announce the schedule of Semester Examinations of all programmes.
- Arranges to conduct the Practical Examinations, Project work including Viva voce to all required Courses.
- Receive practical OMR mark sheets from the respective departments
- Receive the filled in Examination Applications from UG, PG and M.Phil Students and upload the same in Exam Cell software through QR code.
- Preparing and registration of the list of candidates and the subjects, for which they
 appear.
- · Arranges to download Hall Ticket.
- Generates login facility to each mentor to enter CIA marks through intranet.
- Appoints Scrutiny Committee to scrutinize Semester Examinations question papers to check whether the question paper is as per the norms and free from errors.
- Printing and sealing of Semester Examinations question papers and handed over to Controller of Examinations for safe custody.
- Arrange to distribute Semester Examinations Time-Table to respective department for Notice Board display and made available in the college website.
- Appoints Observer and Squad for Semester Examination.
- Conducts the Semester Examinations after getting approval from the Chief Superintendent.
- Appoint examiners for evaluation of Semester Examinations answer scripts.
- Dummy number generation for received answer scripts.
- Arranges for evaluation of papers.
- Organises the result passing board.
- Publishes the results, issues the Statement of Grade and Consolidated Statement of Grade to the students.
- Arranges for the revaluation of answer scripts whenever necessary or requested by the concern student.

- Arranges for conduct of instant examinations for outgoing students after the publication of final results.
- Arranges to get the Provisional Certificates and Degree Certificates from the Affiliating Thiruvalluvar University.

Evaluation process is carried out by adopting the following measures:

- The answer scripts are packed and sealed immediately after the examination for the session are over and handed over to the COE.
- Evaluation is done by external/internal examiners.
- Single valuation for both UG and PG programs.
- For PG Programmes, all examiners appointed are external.
- Evaluation of practical exam is made jointly by one internal and one external examiner
 - recommended by the Head of the Department of the concerned.
- Moderation upto 3 to 5 marks maybe given to those students who fail to secure the aggregate passing minimum of 40% and 50% in UG and PG programs respectively on the recommendation of the Board of Examiners.
- Publication of results will be done immediately after the approval of the Passing Board soon after evaluation.

Security and Confidentiality:

The question papers are typed, printed and copies made in the office of the COE. They are sealed and kept in the strong Room under the direct custody of the COE. The packed question papers are handed over to the Chief Superintendent for the conduct of examinations on the day of examination to be opened half an hour before the commencement of

Transparency

- Any student can get a photocopy of the valued answer scripts by paying the Prescribed Fee.
- Any student can seek revaluation for only one current arrear paper of a particular semester. Revaluation of more than one paper will be allowed only on the basis of the recommendation of the Head of the Department concerned however, revaluation of previous semester paper is not allowed.
- Internal assessment is finalized only if accepted and signed for by the students.

Instant Examination

Instant Examination will be conducted every year during the month of June/July for those candidates who have completed their study and have not passed in only one paper. The fee for Instant Examinations shall be fixed by the Governing Body from time to time. A separate Grade sheet will be issued for instant examination.

Examination Reforms

COE has brought the following reforms in autonomous examination

- The office of the Controller of Examinations will prepare the Examination Calendar, well before the start of the academic year, which would enable the Academic section, to plan & prepare the Academic Calendar every year. The Examination Calendar for Odd & Even semesters, Course structure for UG, PG & M.Phil programs were included in Student's Hand Book.
- Introduction of OMR based answer script for the paper Value Education & Environmental Studies subjects.
- Entry of CIA marks via intranet/internet from the respective departments.
- CIA answer scripts are shown to the students after evaluation for their information which provides transparency and accountability in the evaluation process and students grievances are taken care of and are redressed in a timely manner.
- The absentees of the internal tests are given an opportunity by head of the department if they have valid reasons.
- Question papers for 100% CIA courses and OMR based examination shall be set by the respective mentor and scrutinized by the HOD of the respective department.
- The question papers are checked for the correctness, timing, and traits of Bloom's taxonomy including higher order thinking skills.
- Provision for change of M.Phil. Dissertation title, if needed, a separate application should be submitted at least 15 days in advance prior to the last date for submission of dissertation with prescribed fee.
- Appointment of observer/squad will be decided by the Principal time to time
- Examination for all the arrear papers (theory only) will be conducted along with regular Semester Examinations.
- Instant examinations will be conducted for those candidates who have completed their study and have not passed in only one paper
- Semester examination Time-Table and seating arrangements are automated.

- Receives Semester examination applications through QR code, which would easily enable the authenticity.
- New format of Answer Booklet is introduced from April 2019, with student's photo,
 Subject details (Course, Subject code, Register No, date of examination) with QR code for security and benefit of students.
- Randomized dummy number generation from the QR code of answer script.
- Results are declared within three to five days from the last day of examination.
- The students are given an option to apply either for getting photocopy of the evaluated answer sheets or revaluation.
- When the students apply for the revaluation, the answer sheets are not evaluated by the examiner, who has done the first round of evaluation. The same would be given to a senior faculty member, who is a known subject expert, for revaluation.
- If the difference in the marks scored by the candidate by the two examiners is less than 10, then the highest mark would be awarded to the candidate.
- On the other hand, if the difference of marks awarded by the two examiners is more than 10, then the revaluation process would be allotted to a third examiner. After third evaluation, COE decision would be the final.
- The office of the COE has appointed internal squad for the prevention of malpractices in the internal & Semester examination.
- To make the system and process more transparent and precise, an examination manual
 has been brought out by the Office of COE and the same is disseminated to all the
 stakeholders.
- Scribe facility is provided for the needy students.
- Semester examination application download through student login.
- · Online examination fee payment.
- Hall Ticket downloads.
- Attendance percentage view to the individual student.
- Exam seating arrangement in web portal for student view.
- Online payment system is followed in the office of the Controller of Examinations for Exam. Hall invigilators, practical examiners and evaluators.

Quality improvement strategies adopted by the office of the Controller of Examinations.

- The Controller of Examinations organise the Continuous Internal Assessment Tests (CIA), Semester Examination and the evaluation of the answer scripts.
- The internal assessment test schedules are prepared and communicated to the students
 well in advance. The pattern, quality and correctness of the question papers with
 Bloom's Taxonomy prepared by the faculty for the internal assessment test are
 verified by the head of the department
- The absentees of the internal test are given an opportunity by the head of the department if they have valid reason.
- The evaluation methods adopted by the college are informed to all the students at the beginning of the academic year by the respective mentors.
- The students are provided with the corrected answer-scripts of CIA tests by the relevant faculty members, which provide transparency and accountability in the evaluation process.
- Grievances of the students such as Queries related to subject codes, change of Non-major subjects, incorrect entry of CIA tests marks, Missing codes in Hall ticket etc., are resolved immediately.
- The Examination committee continuously monitors the periodical activities of the Examination Cell to ensure the continuous and comprehensive evaluation of the students and timely conduct examinations.
- The office of the controller of examinations provides Odd and Even semester calendar
 and course structure of programme in the College Handbook issued to the students
 and faculty members at the beginning of the academic year.
- The results of the Semester Examinations are published within 5 days from the date of completion of the examination, which helps the students to join companies immediately/ plan their next higher studies.

DEPARTMENT OF LIBRARY AND INFORMATION SCIENCE

The Library was established in the formative years of the College. The College witnessed the Library crossing one milestone after another to become a mammoth monolith with a collection exceeding 80,000 books on its shelves. The Library houses not only the subject books but also rare collections of philosophy, logic, politics and languages. The Library functions on the basis of Open Access System in which the students and staff have facilities for unlimited usage of the treasure trove.

The College provides ample scope and opportunity to the students to read and learn a lot from a wide spectrum of newspapers, magazines and periodicals available in the Reading Room. The College subscribes 125 national and international periodicals and 11 newspapers. We have back volumes (Journals) 2651, M.Phil., Dissertations 830, Ph.D. Theses 140 and CD/DVD 494.

The College has a Video Library with video cassettes and CDs relevant to curriculum. For the benefit of the staff, postgraduate students and research scholars, the Library has a Computer Centre with internet facility. The college has been subscribing more than 30,00,000 e-books and 6000+ e-journals through INFLIBNET & DELNET. The Library has NPTEL e-learning video courses, and also provides DSpace for Institutional Repository system.

The Reference Section of the Library quenches the scientific thirst of the scholars of host and surrounding institutions. The Library has Reprographic facility WiFi enabled and fully automated by SOUL 2.0 software and all books are bar-coded. Virtual Library was launched on 30th September 2014. Library Hand Book- A User Manual highlighting "How to make use of Library Resources including e-Resources" is readily available and distributed to all Students and Staffs. They are trained by the Librarian through orientation Programmes at regular interval of time. This is one of the best practices of the Library.
